

ST. JOSEPH HILL CEMETERY REGULATIONS

1. All graves* reserved for registered**members of St. John Paul II Church are \$500.00. (To be reviewed every five years). A name must be listed for each grave.
2. Former members of St. Joseph Hill/St. Paul Church may reserve graves for \$900.00. Nonmembers with immediate family (Parents, Children, and Siblings) who were registered members of St. John Paul II Church and buried here, graves will be \$900.00. The Parish Office needs to be contacted before any burial, including ashes.
3. Registered members of St. John Paul II may pay for graves over a period of two years.
4. A fee of \$200.00 per burial (including cremations) must be paid at the time of burial to a perpetual cemetery fund. This is not included in the grave price of grave opening fee.
Opening/closing for cremains--\$100.00.
5. All money received for graves will be used for the care and maintenance of cemetery.
6. Any person who reserves grave sites and wishes to transfer them to another person or persons must receive approval from the Cemetery Committee. A written transaction must be filed with the Cemetery Committee.
7. In former years, church members could reserve eight graves in a whole lot. Also, the eight grave lots were reserved for the owners of their immediate family (Parents, Children, and Siblings)—not Grandchildren, etc. (Refer to #1). In time, if all these family members are deceased, any remaining graves will be transferred back to St. John Paul II Church.
8. No shrubs, plants, or trees will be planted in the cemetery. All flowers must be placed on the grave stone or on hangers on the ground.

*A grave is defined as enough space to accommodate a concrete, or any other, underground vault and headstone. (Usually 3.5 feet x 10 feet). Headstones should not exceed 18 inches x width of grave or graves. Any exceptions to a 36" standard headstone must be approved by the Cemetery Committee.

**An active member is defined as a member who is a regular contributor financially, is involved in some Parish activities, and attends St. John Paul II Church regularly, health permitting.
